Art Department Chair, 1994 – 2010, 2011-2016 (exception - 2010-2011 full-year sabbatical)

Accomplishments as department chair include a revitalized expanded curriculum, increased student interest in arts courses, substantial increase in the number of art majors, departmental commitment to the general studies program, implementation of an assessment program, expansion of facilities, expansion of the visual arts faculty, increased budget for supplies, and the addition of new equipment ranging from studio easels to new computers. All of this was initiated by the strategic plan for the department adopted in 1995 as part of the SACS self-study.

Expanded the department to two full-time faculty members and a full-time gallery curator with 50 percent teaching responsibilities. In 2016 we expanded course offerings to include museum studies. The department also regularly maintains more than 25 majors. I led curricular revisions in two majors and designed a new graphic design major with a strong emphasis in digital art. Additionally, I implemented digital photography. In 2006, I served on the General Education Committee and successfully advocated for an artistic expression requirement for all undergraduate students as an integral part of a liberal arts education. The department now serves a high percentage of Emory & Henry students who take art as an elective or for the purpose of enhancing their general education experience.

For more than two decades I led the departmental assessment critical for continued SACS accreditation. This has been an evolving process that included annual assessment report, recorded senior exit interviews, portfolio assessment for art majors, and coordination among faculty members for data.

In 2006, I led departmental members in the planning and design of the new art studios for the Byars Hall renovation. This 7 million dollar project now houses safe, well-lit, spacious, well-equipped studios for painting/drawing, design/printmaking, traditional photography, digital art, graphic design and art history. Beginning in the fall of 2010, I completed design proposals for a new art annex to for three-dimensional art. The new facility opened in 2012, houses a studio for three-dimensional art (Crafts sculpture and 3D design) and a separate studio for clay complete with modernized equipment.
